Natural treatment for horses

Trial 5

Veterinarian: Dr. John Kuck

Patient: Canine, 16 year old, Male – Nuetered, German Shepard Mix

Presenting Problem: Patient presented on 4/27/17. Client reported constant licking at the left Elbow. Developed Swelling with resistant drainage and raw skin over left lateral elbow. Focal Area or alopecia and erythema, clearly irritated and inflamed. (Image #1)

Treatment: Area was clipped, scrubbed and scabbing was removed. Elbow was bandaged.

Check-Up Exam: Patient returned for follow-up exam 5 days following initial exam. Report of bandage not staying on, and no improvement to the elbow.

Diagnosis: Elbow Hygroma

Treatment: Started the patient on oral Cephalexin 500mg BID for seven days. Also started treatment of Spray SW-60 directly on the wound, BID.

Follow Up Client Email: 5/13/17 Email photo from client. (Image #2) Doctor reply... "It looks great! I'm really happy with the way that looks. Keep up the spray and let's see what it looks like in a few days".

Follow Up Client Email: 5/18/17 Email photo from client. (Image #3) Doctor reply... "elbow looks great. I would keep up with the spray for one more additional week".

Assessment of use of SW-60 on this case by doctor treating the case... "I do not think this would have healed as quickly with Cephalexin alone. I have seen a few of these that will not heal at all

because of location and suspected pressure necrosis. I think the spray helped a lot."
